McClugage Bridge Arch "Float-In"

PEORIA – The Illinois Department of Transportation announced that the arch section of the new eastbound McClugage Bridge (U.S. 150) over the Illinois River at Peoria will be moved from its assembly area and put into place Dec. 19, weather permitting.

The process, which involves floating the 652-foot-wide by 130-foot-high arch section on barges and using tugboats to move it to the bridge piers, is expected to begin at approximately 7 a.m., depending on wind conditions. The eastbound McClugage Bridge is being replaced after more than 70 years of serving the Peoria metro area. Scheduled to open to vehicular traffic in 2024, the new structure will deliver improved capacity and safety, reduced travel times and bicycle and pedestrian accommodations.
